GETTING AROUND TOWN

Bus

STCP buses circulate frequently and stop near all Faculties of the University of Porto.

Train

CP urban trains connect the centre of the city to more peripheral areas. All train stations interface with other main public transports.

Subway

Porto has an extended and growing subway network that will take you to the main spots. "A large number of our colleges have a Metro "on the doorstep".

Bicycle or Walking

Porto is compact, and it is easy to walk to most places. You can also opt to help the environment and ride a bicycle. You can rent an electric or conventional U-Bike at U.Porto for your daily commuting needs.

It's time to explore

Your University Path

Now that you will be studying at the University of Porto, we want to help you learn more about your future academic path. Your course may have a duration of three or five/six years depending on your cycle of studies. Here are the five main things you need to know:

1. What is a semester?

A university academic year is divided into two semesters: the first one runs from September to February and the second one from February to July. There are periods of interruption at Christmas, Carnival, Easter and during the non-academic week, in May, according to the previously approved **Academic Calendar**.

2. What subjects will I take?

A "Subject" corresponds to a "Curricular Unit". Your subjects are all the disciplines that are part of your course. Depending on your course, some will be optional, and some will be mandatory. When you enrol in each new academic year, and if you have optional subjects, you may choose your Curricular Units from a list of available options.

U.Porto students, also have access to INOVPED, an interdisciplinary programme that allows students to attend subjects from transversal areas, or from different faculties (only available from the second year).

3. What are academic "credits" and why are they important?

Academic credits represent the "weight" or the "relevance" of a given curricular unit. It's known as ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System). There is a maximum and a minimum number of credits in which you can enrol per year. In your course, some Curricular Units will be worth more credits than others, and this will influence the final average grade of your study cycle.

4. What is my academic schedule?

Your schedule will depend on your course's subjects! In some cases, your schedule may differ from that of your classmates (for example, if you choose different optional subjects).

We have everything organised so that

you can manage your time.

5. How will I receive important notices and information?

All relevant information about your course is available at your Faculty's website. U.Porto students have a personal page on Sigarra's software system where, among many other things, they can receive notices from their Faculty or the Dean's Office, access learning platforms, check their grades and obtain information on tuition fees. U.Porto students also have a personal institutional e-mail, which should be checked frequently.

Your Studies

Entering University can be both a challenge and an adventure. From your classes to your new professors and classmates, we know this is a crucial period of your life! Here is some helpful information to enhance your academic experience:

Classes

Depending on your course, you may have theoretical, theoretical-practical and laboratory classes, whether online (in exceptional cases) or in-person. Your professors will be available to support you whenever you need, through various communication media, but mostly through digital platforms. In some cases, you may need to access specific study books or reference works which should be available in your Faculty's library; in other cases, your professors will share the necessary study materials with you.

Students' assessment

There are several assessment methods. The most common are the "distributed assessment" and the "final exams". Distributed assessment includes academic works, projects, reports, lab work, participation in class and tests, among other possibilities. In the case of final exams, there are two assessment periods - the "regular" season and a "supplementary" season - each semester, which take place after the end of classes. You may either take your exam in one of these seasons or try to improve your final grade in the supplementary season. There is also a "special" season, which is an extra period for completing your course or a period aimed at students covered by this scheme.



EUGLOH: A EUROPEAN SUPER CAMPUS

U.Porto is part of the EUGLOH alliance - European University for Global Health, an European "super campus" which allows you to get in touch with students, professors and researchers from 9 universities of 8 different countries. As a member of EUGLOH, you can also take part in mobility projects - in-person, virtual or blended, short or long term - research and trainning programmes.

4. Your students' association

Each Faculty has a *students' association* whose mission is to represent and protect your interests. Contact your students' association to keep track of recreational activities organised by the association, or access projects related to your course or even study support materials.

Study Spaces

From libraries, to modern study rooms, cafés and cutting-edge laboratories, at the U.Porto campuses you will find a wide range of spaces and structures where you can catch up on your studies.

LIBRARIES

All U.Porto's Faculties have a free-access library. Here, you will have access to many bibliographic resources, such as books, articles, scientific journals and publications that are relevant for your course. Some libraries have an Archive or a Special Collections Room, whos you can access upon previous request. As a student of the University of Porto, you can access the libraries of all Faculties. Some libraries have extended opening hours and are open on Saturdays. Regularly check the information concerning the library's opening hours, usage rules, capacity and book loan conditions on the relevant Faculty website.

STUDY AND WORK ROOMS



Some U.Porto's Faculties will have study rooms, laboratories, studios and other types of spaces available for you to work on practical assignments or group projects, especially during the assessment periods.

E-LEARNING CAFÉS

Looking for a more relaxed place to study? Do you need to use a computer? The Asprela and the Botanical E-Learning Cafés are available for you in the Asprela and Campo Alegre campuses, respectively. The U.Porto E-Learning Cafés are open every day with extended opening hours. And don't forget to enjoy their outdoor spaces to get inspired!

1. Access the Virtual Higher Education Library

Through this catalog, you can have access to a thousand of scientific journals, books and reference works from 30 institutions. This catalog is available online from anywhere.

2. Simply log in with your student's credentials to access international journals and publications

As a U.Porto student, you have free access to a vast list of reference publications. Examples of available sources are the Cambridge University Press, the Sage or the Oxford University Press. Simply log in with your student credentials!





It's time to feel at home

Where to eat

The three campuses of the University of Porto have canteens, snack bars or restaurants where you can lunch, have a snack or dine, at affordable prices.

You can choose between fish, meat, vegetarian or vegan dishes. All complete meals cost €2.95, and you need your student card to access the canteens.

Dinner is only served in the canteens near the Faculty of Arts and the Faculty of Economics.



Scholarships and Funding

At U.Porto, we believe that equal opportunities and the promotion of academic merit are the first step towards the success of our students. With this in mind, we offer you a wide range of scholarships and financial benefits to ensure that your dreams come true!

STUDY SCHOLARSHIPS

If you are enrolled in a Bachelor's, Master's or Integrated Master's programme at U.Porto (students with the International Student Status are excluded), you can apply for a study scholarship offered by the Social Services of the University of Porto (SASUP) and funded by the Portuguese government. These scholarships consist of a monthly cash payment intended to contribute to costs related to attending the course.

MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

Merit scholarships are awarded every year to students enrolled in Bachelor's, Master's and Integrated Master's programmes who display exceptional academic achievement. U.Porto also awards "Incentive Prizes" to the best first-year students of each Faculty.

OTHER SUPPORT

Aside from study scholarships, SASUP also has a Social Support Fund, aimed at students who temporarily find themselves in a difficult economic situation. You may also have your studies financed by study and research scholarships offered by external institutions, government entities, or partner institutions of the University of Porto.

Accommodation

As a U.Porto student, you can apply for one of the 9 halls of residence (+ two studios) managed by the Social Services of the University of Porto (SASUP).

Located close to the faculties, these spaces are primarily intended for students who are beneficiaries of study scholarships and/or those who need accomptadion due to their socio-economic conditions and the distance from their household.

Private halls of residence for university students have become increasingly popular in recent years, offering additional services such as weekly cleaning.

In Porto and the surrounding area, you'll also find a wide range of houses for rent, which you can share with other students.

Culture at your hands


